

Italian Heritage Photo from the 2023 UNICO Heritage Calendar Statues in Florence

Taken by Passaic Valley chapter member Steven Pelonero, this photo appears in the 2023 UNICO National Heritage and Photo Calendar for the month of February

Florence is a city in Central Italy and was the center of medieval European trade. Its political history included rules by the Medici family. The city is noted for its culture, Renaissance art, architecture, monuments, museums and art galleries. Due to Florence's artistic and architectural heritage, Forbes ranked it as the most beautiful city in the world in 2010. It is also ranked one of the top 15 fashion capitals of the world



Monthly Member Spotlight of our Italian Heritage

Charles Russo

His family history is from Avelino, in the Campania Region of Italy

Avellino is a town and comune, capital of the province of Avellino in the Campania region of southern Italy. It is situated in a plain surrounded by mountains 29 miles east of Naples.





The new city was surrounded by massive walls and had an orthogonal hippodamian urban layout.

The 1980, the Irpinia earthquake represented a turning point for the town and for the entire province of Avellino. Large amounts of money flowed in for infrastructure investment, and the extra money generated innovation and economic expansion.

Agriculture was at the heart of Avellino's economy until the mid-1970s.

Since then, many younger people have moved away from family farms, and sometimes also migrated away from the area in pursuit of higher wages. Nevertheless, tobacco, viticulture and especially the production of hazelnuts remain important to the local economy and, with increased investment in recent years, employ a number of people.

The manufacturing sector plays an important role in Avellino, with two industrial zones on the eastern and western peripheries of the main urban area, at Pianodardine suburb, Montefredane, Prata di Principato Ultra and Pratola Serra. Many small and medium-sized businesses are located in the industrial zones, including notably FMA (Fabbrica Motori Automobilistici, Automobile Engine Factory) who produces the Fiat Pratola Serra modular engines for Fiat, Opel, Jeep, Lancia and Alfa Romeo, and creator of the "multi-jet" (fuel injected) car engine.

In the HBO television series The Sopranos, mob boss Tony Soprano has his family roots in Avellino.

Tony's grandfather, Corrado Soprano Sr, a stonemason, emigrated from Avellino to the United States in the early 20th century. In the episode "In Camelot", Corrado's son Junior Soprano claims: "The whole village of Avellino settled in this area" in which the main characters live, in Essex County, New Jersey.

There are no soldiers overseas that need our assistance at this time.


Scholarship ~ Chair: Chuck Russo
